
1. Receiving the bread and drinking from the chalice, or

From the Pastor

Beloved of God in Christ Jesus,

Wednesday of this week is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Lent is a time of preparation for our holiest time of the year, the Passion, Crucifixion, Death, and resurrection of Jesus.

We begin with the symbol of fallen man... ashes. From dust and ashes we come, unto dust and ashes we return. The ashes of Ash Wednesday are a reminder of our sinfulness, imperfections, fragileness, and mortality. But, that is not all. The ashes are also a sign of hope, new beginnings, and new life.

In the course of life, we will encounter many events, people, or things which will cause us pain, suffering, sorrow, and disappointment. There will be failures and mistakes made in life. Our leaders and society will not always be just or kind to us. But, we rise again from ashes. The fire burns the forest or the prairie and from the ashes a new forest and a new prairie grows, sometimes richer and more vibrant than the old one!

We fail, we experience loss or disappointment. We start again, we forgive and move on, we may even find love again and we finally find success, meaning, even happiness.
